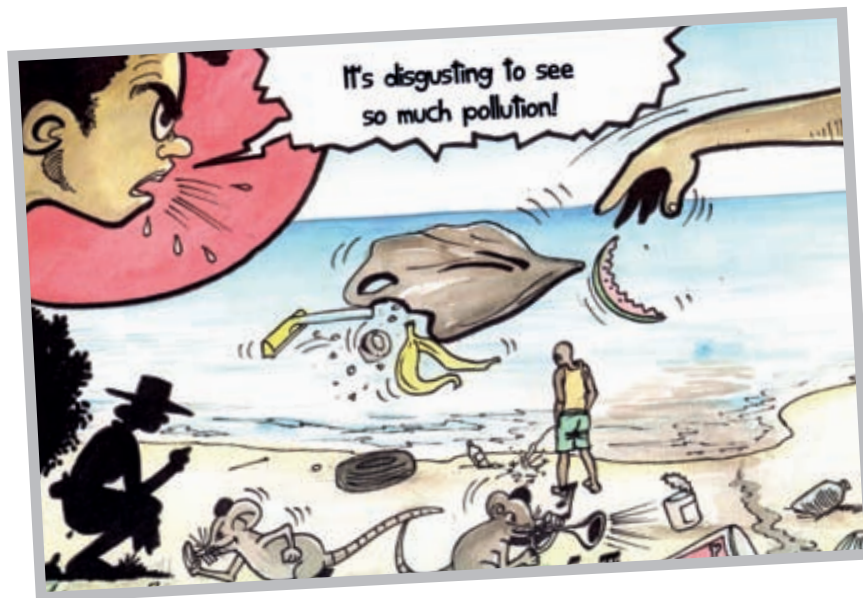


TEACH SOMEONE OLDER

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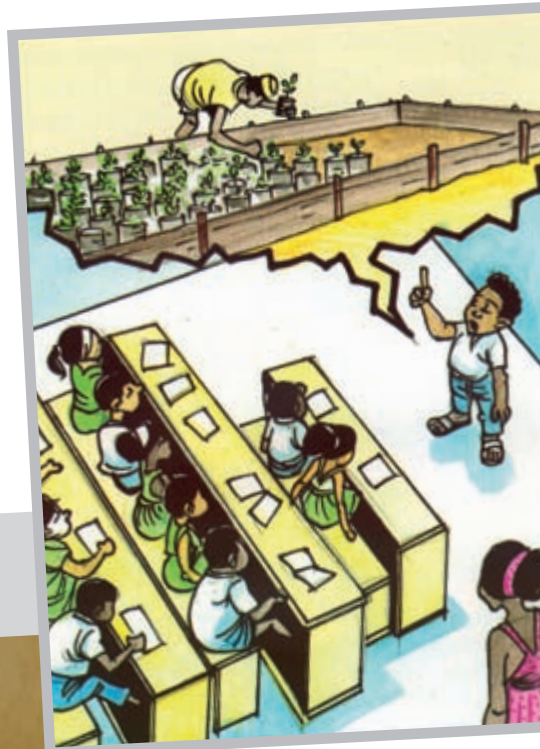
HOW? BE AWARE AND LEAD BY EXAMPLE!!
